An intern position is not guaranteed to all those who are interviewed. Internship meetings will start Week 3 and continue every Thursday from 4-6pm. The Internship program offers an opportunity for students to gain a perspective on one's identity and community by focusing on the historical context of the Southeast Asian community and current issues that affect us now.
